October is a popular month with a lot of you for many reasons, not the least of which is that we can finally begin to look forward to some cooler weather. Please let it be so this year!

This is also the time of year when we begin to look ahead to our annual Board of Directors Election. This year there will be two positions on the Board to be filled. If you are interested in serving your community in this capacity, start thinking about submitting your resume to be included on this year's ballot. *The deadline to submit your resume is 1:00 pm, October 21, 2021* (before the Budget & By-Laws Meeting).

If you see a "Closed for Mowing" sign posted at the dog park, please be patient and wait for Outside Maintenance to finish before entering with your dog. This is for your safety and that of your pet.

In keeping with the same, we have received notice from WREC that <u>for safety and reliability of their service to us</u> they will be removing and trimming vegetation that is impacting the overhead power lines along the borders of our community. Over the years, there has been an increase of fast-growing, invasive species of trees from inside the fence that needs to be trimmed or removed. WREC will need access to both rear, and in some cases, front lawns depending on the location of overhead power lines in order to complete this work. Once any trees have been cut to a stump of 3" or less they will be treated with a mild agricultural grade herbicide called Trycera to retard growth for at least 5 years.

We will have representatives from WREC speak at an upcoming General Meeting to explain this procedure further. In the meantime, they have expressed their appreciation for our cooperation and understanding. We will advise you of any further information we receive concerning this matter.



Landscaping Tips

"Bedding Plants, Bulbs, Herbs, Vegetables, Lawn Fertilizing, Fertilizing Shrubs/Ornamental Trees, Strawberries and Free Landscaping Classes"

"A garden is never so good as it will be next year." – Thomas Cooper

Bedding Plants – Even though temperatures are still warm, according to the University of Florida Extension Service, now is a good time to begin planting annuals like the Petunia, Pansy, and Dianthus for your fall garden. See: *Annuals*:

Bulbs – For beautiful blooms next spring or summer, now is the time to plant Agapanthus (African Lily/Lily of the Nile), Rain Lily, and many other varieties of Lily. For best results don't forget to amend your soil with organic compost to the planting bed. Additional info: *Bulbs for Florida*: http://edis.ifas.ufl.edu/topic bulbous flowers

Herbs – Garlic, Sage, Cilantro, Chives, and Parsley are some of the herbs that can be planted from seed or plants. See: Herbs: http://edis.ifas.ufl.edu/topic herbs

Vegetables – Broccoli, collards, kale, and lettuce are some of the vegetables that you can plant now and have produce throughout the winter. See: *Vegetable Gardening in Florida*:


Lawns – Mid October is the last time of year for Fertilizing St. Augustine and Bahia lawns. Choose a fertilizer (not a weed & feed) with little or no Phosphorus (unless a soil test indicates a need) with a timed-released Nitrogen for longer lasting results. Follow the instructions on the label, it's the Law! See: Lawn Fertilizer: http://edis.ifas.ufl.edu/topic_lawn_fertilization

October is also the last month of the year to **Fertilize Shrubs and Ornamental Trees** especially those that are not performing as well as desired. Use a Controlled-release fertilizer to provide nutrients over a longer period of time. You must follow label application instructions. For more: *Nutrient Deficiencies:*
